The accepted videos are available online, and we encourage everyone to view and share the full videos. We would like to thank the ICCBR 2017 Conference Organizers for putting together an excellent conference, the Workshop Chairs for editing the workshop proceedings, the Awards Committee for their work selecting award winners, and the video authors for the time and effort it took to produce such an excellent collection of videos! Hopefully everyone enjoys the videos as much as we do.
